Grammar 5 A: Adverbs

Adverbs	Some Exceptions:
modify verbs (adverbs of manner), adjectives/past participle and other adverbs - usually by providing information how something is done or the degree of an adjective/past participle (adverbs of degree) or adverb (adverbs of degree). Most adverbs are formed by adding -ly or -ally to an adjective. There are also adverbs of place and time (e. g. "there", "yesterday"), adverbs of frequency (e. g. "sometimes", "never") and sentence adverbials (e. g. "actually").	Good-well, fast-fast, hard-hard, early-early, late-late, high-high, friendly – in a friendly way ... "Hardly" means: "almost not", "Nearly" means: „almost but not quite“... Some adjectives can follow certain verbs (verbs of appearance and sense): e. g. forms of "to be", "get", "grow", "taste", "smell", "feel" ...

Grammar 5 B: Modal Verbs /

Modal Verbs	Alternative Forms:
can (expressing ability or possibility) – negative form: "cannot" or can't",	be able to (expressing ability), could (expressing general ability or permission)
may (asking for permission or expressing possibility) – negative form: "may not" or "must not" (expressing strong forbiddance),	be allowed to (expressing permission), might (expressing possibility and/or that a situation is not real)
Must (expressing necessity to do something) – negative form: "need not (needn't)" or "do not (don't) have to",	have to (more impersonal than must)
Should (expressing advice and opinion or expectation) – negative form: "should not (shouldn't)"	ought to
